Mission Statement

Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten, as an outreach ministry of Cornerstone United Methodist Church, nurtures and develops each child's relationship with God.

We believe that each child is a gift from God, and we are committed to the emotional, physical, mental, social, and spiritual development of each child.

We create a firm foundation in both academic and Christian teaching by being compassionate to each child's needs in a cooperative learning environment that emphasizes love, respect, and sharing.

With Christ as our cornerstone, we strive to foster an early love for learning and a lifelong love for God, Christ, and biblical teachings.

Overview

Cornerstone Kids is a Christian-based educational program affiliated with Cornerstone United Methodist Church. The school program consists of the program director, teachers, teachers' aides, and classes for one, two, three, and four year old children as well as a kindergarten class. Cornerstone Kids follows a Christian-centered, age-specific curriculum while nurturing the children in a caring environment. Our students, ages two through six, will meet no more than four hours a day. Our one year old students shall not meet more than four hours a day and no more than eight hours a week as defined by the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning.

The school is organized as follows:

The age criteria for each class is as follows:

AGE	CRITERIA
1	One year old on or before September 1 st ; must be able to walk without assistance; eat “table” food; able to drink from a “sippy” cup
2	Two years old on or before September 1 st ; must be able to walk without assistance; eat “table” food; able to drink from a “sippy” cup
3	Three years old on or before September 1 st and potty trained*
4	Four years old on or before September 1 st and potty trained*
K	Five years old on or before September 1 st and potty trained*

We follow the same age requirements as Coweta County Schools. Children may be placed in classes other than these criteria would indicate only with the approval of the program director, the child’s parents, and the receiving teacher. This placement would only be considered for placing a child in a younger class and would be appropriate for children with disabilities or other situations that have slowed their development. The Preschool Advisory Committee would resolve any dispute over this placement.


***Potty Trained:** Children must be able to use the bathroom independently, which includes: being comfortable asking or identifying when to use the restroom without reminders, pulling pants up/down, and capable of wiping independently. We understand accidents happen, but frequent or multiple accidents in a day are indications a child is not completely potty trained. Parents will be notified if their child is not regularly in control of his/her bathroom needs.

AGGRESSIVE AND DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR

For the protection of your children, our policy on biting, pushing, hitting, bullying, defiance and any other aggressive and/or disruptive behavior is as follows:

Teachers will be asked to keep records of incidents. If another child shows an act of aggression toward your child, your child’s teacher or the director will notify you. The teacher or director will also notify parents and the Preschool Advisory Committee of children who behave aggressively toward others. If the child exhibits this type of behavior up to three times, the child will need to be removed from the classroom for a period of one week. If this same behavior continues, the child will be removed from the classroom for the remainder of the school year. No refunds will be given.

The same policy applies for any behavior that is aggressive or disruptive to the point that it puts other children’s safety and learning at risk.



ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

We offer student drop off/pick up using the car rider lane in the mornings and at dismissal. You may choose to either walk your child to/from class or utilize the car rider service.

Teachers are not permitted to hold a conversation with parents during arrival or dismissal. They must monitor the children and listen for names of students needing to line up for dismissal. If you need to speak to the teacher or director, please wait until all children have been dismissed or ask to be called.

ARRIVAL: Our school day begins at 9:00 a.m. We will unlock the Narthex doors at 8:50 a.m. and begin greeting students. We ask your cooperation in not bringing your child to school before this time, as teachers are busy preparing for the day.

The Narthex doors will be locked at 9:00 a.m. Teachers must be in their classroom at 9:00 a.m. We begin each morning with Pledge & Prayer at 9:05 a.m. in the Narthex. If you arrive after 9:00 a.m., please park and walk your child into the building using the office door entrance. We will walk your child to class. If you walk your child to class, you will need to sign-in on the visitor sheet and place a visitor sticker on your shirt.

DISMISSAL: We will begin releasing children promptly at 12:00 p.m. from the Narthex. We ask that you pick up your child or be in the car rider lane no later than 12:10 p.m. Students not picked up by 12:10 will be taken to the preschool office. The late fee is \$10 for the first five minutes and \$1 a minute will be added for each additional minute you are late. If you know you are going to be late, please call the church office 770-304-9397 if the preschool office does not answer.

EARLY DISMISSAL: If there is a need to pick up your child before dismissal, please inform the teacher. You will need to enter through the office door and inform the preschool office staff that you are taking your child early and fill out the Early Dismissal form located by the preschool office door. We will get your child and bring them to the office.

Transportation Changes: If someone new/different is picking up your child from school, please send a note in the communication folder including the name and phone number of the person picking up your child. Please inform them that they will need a picture ID. We will check the ID. If there is ever any question in our minds, we will not release your child until we have contacted you for verification.

WE WILL NOT RELEASE YOUR CHILD TO ANYONE OTHER THAN PARENTS UNLESS WRITTEN PERMISSION IS GIVEN IN ADVANCE.

***Kindergarten students** are dismissed at 1:00 p.m. Mondays-Thursdays. On Fridays, dismissal will be from the Narthex at noon. We will use the same procedures as noon dismissal.

**** All students will be dismissed at Noon on the last Wednesday of each month to allow for Staff planning. Please refer to the monthly calendar for the dates.**

CAR RIDER DROP OFF/PICK UP PROCEDURES

To ensure the safety of your child, we offer car rider drop-off/pick-up at Cornerstone Kids. We have outlined some guidelines that should help us get your child safely and quickly in and out of school. We encourage you to use this service. Please refer to the map on page 16.

CAR RIDER ARRIVAL: Please hang your car tag on your rearview mirror. Drive to the circle and put your car in park. Please keep your child safely buckled and in his/her car seat. Please allow a teacher to unbuckle your child when dropping off. We have had several close calls with children falling out of cars. A teacher will walk your child to his/her classroom. For safety reasons, **no cell phone use** while in the car rider lane. The car rider lane closes at 9:00 a.m. If you arrive after 9:00 a.m., please park and walk your child to the classroom using the office door entrance.

CAR RIDER DISMISSAL: Please drive to the circle and put your car in park. Please hang your car tag on your rearview mirror. Leave the car tag up until after your child is in the car. A teacher will bring your child to you. You are responsible for securing your child in the car seat. Be prepared to show your ID.

All children must have an age-appropriate child seat. Georgia law requires that all children under the age of 8, regardless of height or weight, must be properly secured in an approved car seat or booster seat while riding in an automobile. Each child must be safely buckled into a car seat before you are permitted to leave.

NO CELL PHONE use while in the car rider lanes. We will not release your child to you if you are using a cell phone or other electronic device. This includes talking, texting, gaming, or reading. Please keep your eyes on the children and teachers at all times. Safety first!



WALK-IN PROCEDURES

WALK-IN ARRIVAL: If you choose to walk your child into school, please park in the designated area by the church office. Please hang your car tag on your rearview mirror. Do not park in the circle drive, the playground lot or the back lot. Do not park in the designated handicap spaces, unless you have the proper handicap permit. **Please use the sidewalk to enter the building and do not walk through the car rider lanes.** Please walk your child to the classroom door and tell him/her goodbye stating that you will be back. Please do not walk into the classroom.

WALK-IN DISMISSAL: If you choose to walk in to get your child at the end of the school day, please park in the designated area by the church office and use the sidewalk. Please hang your car tag on your rearview mirror. The children will be waiting in the Narthex. Please wait outside until your child's age group is called to come in. Please keep the area in front of the doors clear so teachers and students can exit the building. Notify the teacher that you are taking your child and leave the building in a timely manner. Be prepared to show ID. Once you leave the building, please move away from the doors so that teachers and students can easily exit the building. You must hold your child's hand at all times.

CERTIFICATION

Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten is certified through the United Methodist Preschool Association of the North Georgia Conference and recognized as “*A Program of Excellence for Young Children.*”

CLASS PARTIES AND BALLOONS

Class parties are held for Fall, Christmas, Easter, and End of the Year. Room Moms coordinate activities for each classroom. Parents’ participation in class parties is optional. Siblings are welcome to attend and must be supervised by parents.

Due to safety concerns, **balloons and water guns are not allowed** at parties or on students’ birthdays.

Parents are welcome to send a special treat (cookie, cupcake, ice cream) for birthday celebrations. We are happy to distribute birthday invitations if the whole class is included in the celebration.

CLOTHING

Children should wear comfortable, washable play clothes. Athletic shoes are strongly preferred and safest for your child. Flip-flops, sandals, rubber boots, non-rubber soled shoes are not allowed as they will interfere with your child’s ability and willingness to participate in playtime activities. For safety purposes, children should wear closed-toed, closed-heel, rubber soled shoes with backs (like athletic shoes). Student not wearing appropriate shoes will not be allowed to climb on the playground or play in the Narthex on rainy days.

Accidents sometimes happen! Please place one change of clothes (shirt, pants, underwear, socks), **labeled** with child’s name, in your child’s back pack. For 1s and 2s, we also ask that you place a minimum of 4 diapers in a **labeled** baggie in the back pack with an ample supply of diaper wipes. If your child is potty training, please pack an extra pair of shoes.

We do play outside daily, weather permitting. In the cold months, please send an appropriate coat, labeled with your child’s name. We will play outside when the temperature is above 40 degrees. Please label all coats, hats, mittens, etc. You are welcome to send a hat for your child to wear outside. No sunglasses please.

COMMUNICATION

You are a very important part of our program, for you are your child’s first teacher. We do invite you to visit and participate in your child’s class. It is important that we exchange ideas and information because you can teach us a great deal about your child. We are here for the children, so it is essential that we know about special events in your child’s life. Anything that might tend to affect your child certainly concerns us (family illnesses, death of a family member or pet, accidents, divorces, moving, etc.) Good communication is essential in order for our relationship to be the most effective.

If you have any concerns, please talk with your child's teacher and the director. **We cannot help with your concerns if we do not know what they are.** The director has an open door policy and invites you to share both praises and problems.

You will receive a weekly newsletter via email from your child's teacher to inform you of what is taking place in the classroom. Please look for important dates and information in these letters. This way, you will be able to talk with your child specifically about things that he/she is doing in school. You will receive a monthly calendar with important dates. The preschool office communicates via a google group (CKPKfamilies@googlegroups.com) and utilizes remind.com for important messages and reminders.

Remind.com is a free, safe, and simple messaging tool to share important messages with parents. All personal information is kept private. This is the fastest way we can communicate reminders, school closings, and urgent news with you.

**Please use the @ symbol and the number zero 0 - not the letter O. Once you have sent the email or text, you will receive a confirmation.

Students will be given a Communication folder to bring to school every day. It should be placed in the largest section of the backpack. The communication folder will be used for all written correspondence, art work, tuition envelopes, etc. Please check the folder daily and return to school daily. Please do not place items in the pockets of the back pack.

CURRICULUM

In our program, your child will be offered many opportunities to grow, learn, and develop new skills through our own thematic-based, Christian curriculum. Units are age-appropriate using creative play activities as well as hands-on learning activities. Activities encompass language development, large and small motor developments, art and music, practical life skills, nature and science, and social and personal growth.

One of the most important parts of the preschool curriculum is providing an environment in which children grow in self-confidence and self-esteem. Children must feel good about themselves and know that God, Jesus, and Cornerstone Kids' staff love them.

Bible stories are taught in each class. We teach one Bible story and Bible verse each month. The three year olds, four year olds, and kindergarteners begin each morning reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and the Lord's Prayer in the Narthex at 9:05 a.m. and attend a weekly chapel service on Wednesday mornings taught by a staff member of Cornerstone United Methodist Church.



Library class is offered once a week for story time and book check-out. Students may check out one book at a time. If a library book is not returned, a reminder notice will be sent home. If a library book is lost or damaged, we ask that parents replace or pay the cost of the book.

Story Time is offered weekly to the community during the school year. Parents and children participate in story time, finger plays and then share in a theme related craft or activity.

Music and Movement class is offered once a week in the music room. All children attend music, and curriculum is age-appropriate. We will have a Christmas program in December and a Spring Program in May.

Ones Program

The one-year-old program focuses primarily on speech, music and art. This is usually the first time that a child is away from Mommy and Daddy, and is vitally important in beginning a positive school attitude. This program utilizes verbalization and gross motor skills in each activity. The one-year-old class is the most unstructured of the classes at Cornerstone Kids focusing on play as a learning tool. A child entering this class must be one before September 1st and walking. This program is offered 2 days a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Twos Program

The two-year-old program builds on using play as a learning tool. The children will also have circle time and table time along with teacher-directed play. Emphasis is on sharing, taking turns, verbalization, gross and fine motor skills. Basic colors, shapes and counting are also introduced.

We offer these options for two-year old classes:

- a two-day class that meets on Tuesdays and Thursdays
- a three-day class that meets on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays

Threes Program

The three-year-old program continues with skills introduced in the two-year-old program, but more in-depth. Circle and table times are longer. Teacher-directed play is more defined with children following simple two or three step instructions. Along with colors, shapes, counting and prewriting skills, the alphabet is introduced and name recognition begins.

We offer these options for three-year old classes:

- a two-day class that meets on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- a three-day class that meets on Mondays, Wednesday, and Fridays
- a three-day class that meets on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays
- a four-day class that meets on Monday, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays

Fours Program

The four-year-old program is one of the more structured classes at Cornerstone Kids.

Although teacher-directed play is utilized, more table and circle times are used.

Emphasis is on name, letter, and number recognition. Teachers utilize the Learning without Tears Curriculum, which includes Get Set for School for language, literacy and math skills and Handwriting without Tears for early handwriting skills. We also use the Second Step program which teaches children to recognize and manage their feelings and develop attention, focus and listening skills. The goal of the four-year-old program is to prepare the child for a positive year in kindergarten.

We offer these options for four-year old classes:

- a four day class that meets on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays
- a five day class that meets on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays

Kindergarten Program

The Cornerstone Kids kindergarten program follows the Georgia Performance Standards and the GKIDS requirement for students. Our kindergarten program utilizes the *Beginning to Read, Write, and Listen* curriculum by McGraw-Hill for phonics and early reading skills, *Weekly Reader* for science and social studies, and *Hands-On Standards* for math. The kindergarten students attend 4 field trips to maximize their learning experience. The goal of the kindergarten class is to prepare the child for a positive year in first grade.

Kindergarteners attend school from 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM (Monday - Thursday) and 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM (Friday). **Kindergarten students** should bring a packed lunch including a drink in a spill-proof container (juice box/water bottle). They will not eat a snack. They will eat lunch midway through the day.

HEALTH

In an effort to protect all of our children from the spread of contagious illnesses, we ask that you please keep your child at home if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

Earache	Runny nose with thick, colored mucus
Fever	Nausea/Vomiting
Sore throat	Skin Rash
Diarrhea	Pink, red or swollen eyes
Cough	

Your child must be symptom free and fever free without medication for 24 hours before returning to school.

We work hard at school to keep your child safe and healthy by washing hands frequently, encouraging students to cover mouth with a tissue or elbow when sneezing/coughing, and sanitizing, and cleaning tables and toys.

In order to best meet your child's educational needs, please notify the director and your child's teachers of any special needs or allergies your child may have. If you have a concern about your child's development, please speak to your child's teacher and/or the director.

If medication is to be given at school, please fill out the medication form and have it signed by the doctor. All students who have a prescription for an Epi-Pen will be given an Allergy Action form to be completed and signed by a doctor. Medications are stored in a locked room and are accessible by all teachers.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

If Coweta County Schools close or have a delay, Cornerstone Kids Preschool will be closed. We will notify parents using Remind.com and email. Any days missed due to inclement weather will not be made up nor will tuition or Lunch Buddy refunds be given.

IMMUNIZATION RECORD

The Georgia Department of Health requires that we have a current Immunization Form on file **BEFORE** your child can attend school. Immunization Form 3231 is due on your child's first day of school. No exceptions. This form may be obtained from your pediatrician or the public health department. If your child's immunization expires during the school year, please submit an updated form 3231 within one week of the expiration date.

INSURANCE

Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten is covered with liability insurance in the amount required by the State of Georgia.

LUNCH BUDDY

Lunch Buddy is an optional service offered by our teachers Monday–Thursday from 12:00p.m.–1:00p.m. The children bring their lunch from home and eat and play. When the weather is nice, the children will play outside on the playground. In inclement weather, they will play inside. There is no educational instruction during Lunch Buddy. This extension of the day is a fun, social-time for children that have already adjusted to school and do not need an early afternoon nap. Parents or guests will not be allowed to eat lunch with students during Lunch Buddy.

To participate, simply purchase a Lunch Buddy tag and clip it to your child's backpack and send a lunch. Children should bring a healthy lunch to school including a drink in a spill-proof container. Please label all lunch boxes, bags, and containers with your child's name.

The cost is \$25 for a bundle of 5 Lunch Buddy tags or \$6 each. Lunch Buddy tags may be purchased from the director during arrival at the Welcome Center or you may send payment with a note and place in the communication folder. If you include Lunch Buddy payment with a tuition check, please write a note indicating how many Lunch Buddy tags you are purchasing.

Permanent Lunch Buddy: You may purchase an annual permanent Lunch Buddy Tag for a discounted price. Pricing for the Permanent Tags will be sent home on the first day of school. Permanent Lunch Buddy Prices are effective Sep 4 – May 15. and must be pre-purchased by September 4. *The first week of Lunch Buddy (August 27-30) is not included in the permanent pricing. You will need to purchase LB tags for this week.

Monthly Lunch Buddy tags may also be purchased at the rate of \$5/day prior to the 1st of the month. These amounts will be included in the monthly calendar and weekly email from the director.

Dismissal from the Lunch Buddy program is at 1:00 p.m. – Dismissal for Lunch Buddy will follow the same procedures as regular noon dismissal. You may park in the office lot and walk in to pick up your child, or you may take advantage of the car rider service. Students not picked up by 1:05 p.m. will be taken to the preschool office. The late fee for Lunch Buddy is \$10 for the first five minutes and \$1 a minute for each additional minute.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

In the event of a medical emergency, every possible effort will be made to contact you immediately. Teachers and staff are CPR and First Aid trained.

Please notify the director and your child's teachers in writing of any allergies your child may have. We will make an "allergy action" plan specific to your child's allergy.

PERSONAL TOYS

Children should not bring toys and items to which they are personally attached ("blankies", stuffed animals, pacifiers, etc.) from home unless they have been requested to do so by the teacher, for show and tell, or another special event. The classroom is a place where children learn to share toys and take turns. It is better for children to play with school toys in a shared setting. Playing with school toys minimizes personal disappointment when a toy breaks. Personal items that interfere with learning will be placed in your child's backpack.

SECURITY

Keeping children safe is a priority at Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten. The Narthex doors or main entrance will be unlocked at 8:50 a.m. each morning. It will then be locked at 9:00 a.m. We do invite you to visit and participate in your child's class. We ask that during school hours, you enter through the office door, sign-in and receive a sticker. The Narthex doors will be unlocked at 12:00 p.m. for dismissal.

If you have given written permission for someone new (to us) to pick up your child, then please inform them that they will need a picture ID. We will check the ID. If there is ever any question in our minds, we will not release your child until we have contacted you for verification.

Each student will also be issued a bag tag that must remain on his/her book bag at all times. The bag tag provides a list of authorized persons to pick up your child as well as a list of emergency contact numbers. Changes to the bag tag need to be made in writing and given to the director.

WE WILL NOT RELEASE YOUR CHILD TO ANYONE OTHER THAN PARENTS UNLESS WRITTEN PERMISSION IS GIVEN IN ADVANCE.

SNACKS

You will be assigned certain dates to bring snacks for your child's class. Please do not send cookies, candy or chips. Children in the 1s and 2s classes bring sippy cups labeled with child's name. Children in 3s and 4s are given water to drink. Please remember to send utensils, if needed.

If you have questions about a snack, please check with your child's teacher. If a child has a food allergy, we will communicate with parents the type of food not allowed for snack.

Kindergarten students should bring a packed lunch including a drink in a spill-proof container (juice box/water bottle). They will not eat a snack. They will eat lunch midway through the day.

SOCIAL MEDIA

We have several children in our program whose parents do not want their child's picture posted on social media (Facebook, Instagram, etc.), so please be mindful of uploading pictures from school events. If you have other children's faces in your pictures, edit them out or talk to the parents before posting. Some children's safety depends on this!

TRANSPORTATION CHANGES

All transportation changes must be made in writing. If someone new/different is picking up your child from school, please send a note in the communication folder including the name and phone number of the person picking up your child. Please inform them that they will need a picture ID. We will check the ID. If there is ever any question in our minds, we will not release your child until we have contacted you for verification.

TUITION AND REGISTRATION

Tuition is due on the 15th of each month. You may pay by cash (exact change only) or check payable to Cornerstone Kids. Please put the cash or check in the tuition envelope provided each month and return to school in the communication folder. Please let us know if you wish to pay using your bank's bill pay program. Tuition not paid by the 20th of the month is considered late and a \$20 late fee will be added. For your benefit, the yearly tuition rate is prorated over a nine-month payment schedule (August – April), and the same amount is due each month.

The registration fee is the same as one month's tuition and due at registration. There is no discount for the registration fee as this is used to cover classroom supplies for the year. Registration fees are nonrefundable.

*Kindergarten students have a one-time book fee of \$100.00 that is due May 15th and a one-time enrichment fee of \$100 that is due the June 15th.

Members of Cornerstone UMC receive a \$10 tuition discount each month. A \$10.00 discount on the tuition fee is allowed for each additional child when there is more than one child from the same family.

Students whose tuition or fees is unpaid after 30 days are subject to removal from program.

Withdrawal of your child's enrollment in our school requires a 30 day written notice or one month's tuition payment.

VISITORS

During preschool hours, all visitors to the church and preschool are asked to enter through the office door, sign-in and receive a visitor sticker. The visitor clipboard is located under the mail box outside of the preschool office door. Please place a visitor sticker on your shirt.

While we certainly welcome all parents, we do have safety policies in place in the church and preschool.
